What's included?

In any event, you are guaranteed the minimum category of cabin we agree to offer at the time of booking. At times, we may offer promotional GTV offers. Such promotional GTV categories are defined as follows: W - Suite / Deluxe, X - Balcony Cabin, Y - Oceanview Cabin, Z - Inside Cabin.

When should I schedule my flight home?

Give yourself several hours between the time you get off the ship and the time you need to board your flight home. Always work on the basis that you must be at the airport for at least 2 hours before your flight's scheduled departure. Baggage porters will be on hand at the port of disembarkation to direct you to taxis, buses and cars.

Consecutive cruises

Consecutive cruises are two or more cruises taken consecutively. Please note that there may be duplication of booked programs, tips, K&K meals are pre-packed and are only available for dinner in the main restaurant. Guests must notify of any dietary requirements at time of booking. Please refer to section 1.15 of the Terms & Conditions below for further information.

Cruise tickets

Your cruise documents are emailed directly to you or you may pick them up as far as 45 days prior to your sailing. We no longer print paper tickets. Your reservation must be finalised and paid in full in order to receive your documentation.

What is my luggage allowance?

The maximum luggage allowance for guests boarding our ships is based on 15kg (33 lbs) per person, and also imposes their own baggage allowance, which you must also comply. This is usually less than the cruise allowance. We strongly recommend that you check with the airline to confirm any baggage allowances as allowances vary between airlines and excess luggage fees may apply where you exceed the allowance. In some instances baggage allowance can be reduced to as little as 15kg per person.

Health requirements

Please contact your doctor for advice and the most up-to-date health requirements for all destinations featured in this brochure. Royal Caribbean International welcomes pregnant guests but will not accept guests who will enter their 24th or later week of pregnancy by the beginning of, or at any time during their cruise vacation. Please check our website for full details.

Check in

If you have checked in online, bring your signed SetSail Pass and identification documents with you to the terminal. At the terminal, we will obtain authorizations from you and one of our guest assistance agents will verify your identification documents and issue your SeaPass™ card to board the ship. If you have not checked in online, bring your completed Guest Information Forms, Charge Account & Cruise Ticket Form and Identification documents to the cruise terminal where one of our guest assistance agents will process your cruise documents. If you have any questions, check you in for your cruise and direct you to the ship. To check in online, go to www.royalcaribbean.com.au, click on "Before You Board," then "Online Check-in."

What to wear

Shorts, T-shirts, slacks, trousers, casual skirts, blouses and sundresses are acceptable during the day. For lounging by the pool, pack bathing suits and casual shoes (eg. flip-flops, sandals, trainers). You'll also need some casual shorts and t-shirts or a cover-up for getting in and out of the pool areas. If you're planning to visit our onboard fitness center then bring shorts, t-shirts and socks plus a pair of tennis or running shoes/trainers.

In the evening, there are three distinct types of dress onboard: casual, smart casual and formal. Suggested guidelines for these evening occasions include slacks and for women, sundresses or pants for women. Smart Casual: Jackets and ties for men, dresses or pantsuits for women. Formal: Suits and ties or tuxedos for men, formal dresses for women.

On formal evenings, formal attire is required in the main restaurant. The number of formal nights generally ranges from 1-3 depending on the duration of your cruise.

We also offer casual dining in the evening at the Windjammer Cafe. Bare feet and bathing suits are not allowed at any time during dinner.

What about dining?

You have a choice of several seating times for meals in the main restaurant. Please request your preferred seating and table size at the time of booking and your table number will be confirmed in your cabin at the start of your cruise. Dining times may vary slightly on port or cruises where we do shore excursions.

Alternatively, My Time DiningSM (open seating) is now available, giving guests flexibility with their evening dining. You can decide when you would like to dine between the hours of 18:00 to 21:30 each evening; much like a regular restaurant. If My Time DiningSM is selected, pre-paid gratuities/tips are mandatory. In addition, My Family Time Dining is available onboard selected sailings for the earliest dining time (varies by ship and sailing) for guests aged between 3-11 years at the date of sailing. This offers children quicker service during first dining seating and then they are transferred to the Adventure Ocean kids club. Pre-paid gratuities/tips are not mandatory for My Family Time Dining. Should you wish to book either of these options, please contact your travel agent. My Time DiningSM is subject to availability.

Special dietary requirements

If you have any special dietary needs, Royal Caribbean International can accommodate the following special dietary needs on board: kosher meals, low-sodium, low-cholesterol. Other special diets such as Kosher and lactose-free meals may be available upon advanced request. Note: Kosher meals are pre-packed and are only available for dinner in the main restaurant. Guests must notify of any dietary requirements at time of booking. Please refer to section 1.15 of the Terms & Conditions below for further information.

Other special requests

If you have a special request such as for a baby cot (crib) or refrigerator please give details in writing to your travel agent at the time of booking. Royal Caribbean International will use its best endeavours to satisfy such special requests.

Alcoholic beverages

We will not sell or serve alcoholic drinks to anyone under 21 years of age. However on cruises departing from European, South American and Asian countries and from Australia/New Zealand where the legal drinking age is lower (21, a pre-paid 18 year old person who is sailing with the person aged between 18 to 20, may sign a waiver allowing the 18 to 20 year old to consume alcoholic beverages (beer and wine only). Guests cannot bring alcoholic beverages onboard for consumption or for any other use.

Onboard currency

The currency used on board all Royal Caribbean International ships is US Dollars.

Your onboard account

All Royal Caribbean ships operate on a "cashless" system. When you check in you will receive a SeaPassSM account card and all purchases made onboard the ship are made using your credit card. At check in, you will receive a statement summarizing the charges on your account. To settle your account we require you to register your credit card at check. As all onboard accounts are payable in US Dollars, your credit card provider or financial institution may levy a foreign exchange transaction fee. Please note that when paying by credit card, you must obtain authorizations from your bank or financial institution and in some cases these may be held for up to 30 days after your cruise ends. Please note we do not recommend the use of Debit Cards.

Medical services onboard

There is a medical centre staffed by qualified doctors and/or nurses onboard all Royal Caribbean International ships. Please note that all services provided by the medical centre (including medication, consultations and treatments) are not covered by private health insurance policies or by Australian Medicare and the New Zealand Accident Compensation Corporation (including cruises sailing to any Australian ports within Australia and New Zealand). We strongly recommend that you take out travel insurance to cover any such charges.

Gratuities (tips)

On all of our ships, it is customary to offer gratuities (also known as "service charge" or "tips") to staff members whom you feel have given you good service. For all other sailings to ports/destinations outside of Australia a valid passport and appropriate visa will be required. For your protection it is essential that your passport's expiration date not occur within six (6) months of the voyage termination date. For further information or clarification please contact your travel agent or Royal Caribbean International.

Voltage/adapters

The onboard voltage is 110/220 AC. Certain electrical plug types are necessary US and European adapters. Hair dryers are provided on all ships.

For guests that have chosen to pre-pay their gratuities at the time of booking, vouchers to show you have pre-paid your gratuities will be placed in your cabin approximately two days prior to disembarkation. These vouchers will be provided for you to hand to your Cabin Attendant, Waiter, Assistant Waiter and Head Waiter. These vouchers are non-transferable and cannot be refunded. Additionally, a service charge of 15% for all beverages is automatically added to your beverage purchases.

At the end of your cruise

On the last night of your cruise you will need to:

- Extend gratuities/tips to those who have made your cruise an unforgettable experience (where these have not been prepaid).
- Pack your bags and place them outside your cabin door by midnight. Your cabin steward will give you coloured tags for each piece of luggage. Please put your name and home address on each tag and remove all loose straps from your bags. We will tag and value items with you (such as jewellery, cameras and medication).

Smoking policy

Smoking is only permitted in designated areas of the ship, including outdoors on the Starboard side of the ship. Smoking is also permitted in the Casino, cruise theatre, hallway or corridor. Smoking is not permitted inside any stateroom, however it is permitted on private Oceanview balconies of Balcony and Suite staterooms (including Boardwalk or Central Park) on ships operating on Oasis of the Seas and Allure of the Seas). A US\$250 penalty will be applied to the SeaPass for guests found smoking in staterooms or on the private balconies of Boardwalk and Central Park on Oasis of the Seas and Allure of the Seas. Cigarettes, cigars and pipe tobacco must be properly disposed of and never thrown overboard. A guest must be at least 18 years of age to purchase, possess or use tobacco onboard. Pipe & cigar smoking is only permitted within the Cigar Lounge. If no Cigar Lounge exists on the ship, there will be a designated area for pipe and cigar smoking.

Travelling in a group

Discounts and free places may be available when travelling in a group of 16 or more passengers. Please consult your travel agent for more information. Note that terms and conditions for those travelling in a group are different to those which apply to individual bookings.

Guests with special needs

Many of our ships have cabins designated for guests with physical disabilities. These cabins are shown on the relevant deck plan. At the time of booking (or as soon as possible if the condition arises after booking) please tell your travel agent in writing about any medical or physical condition, which will require special treatment or attention during your cruise or which may or will affect your cruise in any way (including your use of any services or facilities). Please provide as much detail as possible. Please refer to section 1.19 of the Terms & Conditions below for further information.

Minimum age to travel

The minimum age for travel on Royal Caribbean International ships is 21 years old unless accompanied by a parent, guardian or authorised person who is over the age of 21. On board there are certain facilities where entry is restricted by age. Persons using the spa must be over the age of 18. Full details of onboard facilities with age and height restrictions are contained within the Daily Programme, which is available from the Guest Relations Desk.

Security

Royal Caribbean International's highest priority is to ensure the safety and security of all guests. In order to maintain an effective and meaningful security environment and to comply with applicable international, national security laws, regulations and guidelines, Royal Caribbean International has established strict security procedures in the seaport terminals we visit and onboard our ships. All guests must undergo screening all guests and their personal property prior to boarding. We appreciate your cooperation in this endeavor.

What Identification do I need?

It is the sole responsibility of the guest to identify and travel documents and visas. All guests must meet requirements for boarding the ship and entry into the countries visited on your cruise. For Australian citizens travelling on a domestic Australian voyage calling in only Australian ports, a valid passport and visa are issued pictured and laminated ID card (drivers licence/military ID card/government (federal, territory, city or other national) passport) may be used as identification. For all other nationalities, a passport (or other accepted in Australia) is required. Children aged 16 yrs and under travelling on any Royal Caribbean International cruise will require a Birth Certificate to travel or a photo ID. For all other sailings to ports/destinations outside of Australia a valid passport and appropriate visa will be required. For your protection it is essential that your passport's expiration date not occur within six (6) months of the voyage termination date.

For further information or clarification please contact your travel agent or Royal Caribbean International.

Voltage/adapters

The onboard voltage is 110/220 AC. Certain electrical plug types are necessary US and European adapters. Hair dryers are provided on all ships.

Room service

Complimentary room service is available throughout the day. A US\$3.95 service charge will apply between midnight and 6.00am for items ordered from the Light Snacks menu.

Laundry

Laundry and dry cleaning services are available. Prices will vary by garment type. Royal Caribbean International does not provide irons and they are prohibited on cabins as they constitute a fire hazard. There are no self-laundry facilities onboard.

Can I call home from the ship?

You can make ship-to-shore phone calls from your cabin 24 hours a day. The cost is approximately US\$7.95 per minute and will be automatically charged to your SeaPass.

Can my friends and family contact the ship?

Your friends and family can contact your Royal Caribbean International Cruise Ship from Australia by dialing 0011 1732 335 3285. The cost is approximately US\$7.95 per minute and you must have a credit card number ready to enter to complete the call. Additional long distance/mobile phone charge to connect to the USA will also apply.

Shore excursions

Please book your shore excursions as soon as possible since some shore excursions can accommodate only a limited number of participants. Please visit www.royalcaribbean.com.au "Before you Board" to research and book your shore excursions, or contact your travel agent for further information.

Children & infants

Infants sailing on a cruise must be at least 6 months old on the first day of the cruise. Children under the age of 3 years of age can not participate in the Adventure Ocean Youth Programme™ which is restricted to 3-17 years inclusive. Swimming activities are not supervised and no child or infant is allowed to enter the pool while wearing nappies (diapers). Children or infants can only swim if they are toilet trained and under their parent/guardian's supervision. Please refer to section 1.20 of the Terms & Conditions below for further information.

Terms and conditions

The following Terms and Conditions form the basis of your contract with Royal Caribbean International, our Cruises Ltd. In these Terms and Conditions, 'you' and 'your' means and covers all persons named on a booking. Please Note: If you book a Royal Caribbean International cruise, you agree to our terms and conditions, other services such as flights, on-shore accommodation and/or ground transfers) which are arranged or provided by a travel agent or tour operator ("travel arrangements"). If arrangements have not been confirmed, you agree to these terms and conditions of your contract for your entire holiday including the cruise and all other such services and arrangements will be with your travel organiser and not with us. The travel organiser's own booking conditions will apply to your contract with your travel organiser. Please ensure you obtain a copy of these from your travel organiser before or at the time of booking to ensure that those terms are acceptable to you. Please note, we do not have any liability to you in these circumstances. In any event, if we are found liable to you on any basis, our liability and/or obligations to you or your organiser will be no greater or different to the liability and obligations we have under these booking conditions to consumers who have a contract with us. In any such situation we will be fully entitled to rely on all defences, exclusions and limitations contained in the booking conditions set out below. Please read these conditions carefully.

1.1 **Paying for your cruise**
We will require a deposit to secure your booking within 7 days of making your booking (or full payment if booking within 70 days of departure). On some sailings the cost of your deposit is waived on any booking of within 1-7 days of making the booking. After this time if your deposit has not been paid then your booking will automatically cancel.

Deposit amounts vary by cruise duration as follows:

7-14 nights	A\$400
15+ nights & Cruiseabouts	A\$800

We must receive the balance of the cruise cost (after deducting the deposit you have paid) not less than 70 days before departure (90 days for Holiday sailings - Christmas, New Year & Easter departures) unless you book 70 days or less before departure (90 days for Holiday sailings). In each case you must pay the total cruise cost at the time of booking. If we have not received all monies due to us in full and on time, we are entitled to cancel your cruise. We reserve the right to cancel and cancellation charges as set out below (see 1.5) will apply. If you use your credit or debit card to pay us directly for your cruise, please be aware that we may be unable to refund you a balance of your money and your card issuer may choose to charge you a foreign processing fee. We advise you to check the terms and conditions of such foreign transactions with your card issuer in advance of making a payment with your money to pay to a travel agent (whom we have authorised to sell our cruises) for your cruise with us will be held by

the travel agent on our behalf until the money is paid to us. If you are unable to complete the online check-in process, you may be required to pay the cruise cost on your booking. If you have booked via a travel agent, please speak to your travel agent so that the funds can be transferred to us to complete your check-in.

1.2 Confirming your cruise

Providing your chosen holiday is available, we will confirm your booking directly to you by e-mail or by direct by phone or website) or to your travel agent. We will then send you or your travel agent a Confirmation Invoice. A binding contract between us and you will be entered into upon receipt of your Confirmation Invoice. This invoice will show the outstanding balance due on your holiday. As soon as you receive your confirmation invoice, tickets and any other documents related to your holiday, you must check all the details on those documents carefully. If any details appear to be incorrect, you must advise us immediately, as it may not be possible to make changes later. We do not accept any responsibility if you do not tell us about any mistake in any document (including our Confirmation Invoice) within 14 days of our sending it to you or your travel agent.

1.3 Information required from you

We may be required to pass on to immigration authorities, airlines and other relevant authorised bodies, certain personal details relating to our guests. You must provide the relevant details at the time of booking your cruise or no later than 70 days prior to your departure, whichever is the earlier. This information includes passport information, passport, emergency contact and insurance details. We will inform you at the time of booking, or as soon as we become aware of the need for this information. We recommend you visit our website at www.royalcaribbean.com.au and click on "Before You Board," then "Online Check-in" and submit these details online. You will need to have your booking ID and date of sailing from hand or, if we have received the details of information from you at the time of booking, verify that the details we are holding are complete and accurate. Our procedures may change from time to time. We will inform you of any changes at the time of booking or as soon as possible thereafter. If you fail to supply the details requested, both fully and accurately, you may not be permitted to board your cruise ship and we may not be held liable for flight. We will not accept any liability in this situation and we will not pay you any compensation or make any refunds. You will also be responsible for your onward/return travel arrangements. If arrangements have not been confirmed in fines, surcharges, other financial penalties being imposed on us, you will be responsible for reimbursing us accordingly. Please also see Privacy Statement on page 42.

1.4 Price changes

We guarantee that we will not increase the price of your confirmed cruise once we have received full payment of the total cruise price from you or your travel agent. However, we may increase or decrease the prices of unsold cruises at any time before full payment of the cruise price has been confirmed at the time of booking. After your booking is confirmed but before full payment is received, we will only increase the price if there is an increase in the cost of any transport included in the price and/or if you are due a visa or fees for any services (for example, port taxes or charges of any sort). In addition, we will pay the first part of any such increase(s) if you are due a total amount of less than 2% of the cost of your confirmed cruise (excluding any insurance premiums and amendment charges). Only if any such increase(s) exceeds this 2% will we ask you to pay more. If any additional amount we ask you to pay is greater than 10% of the total cost of your confirmed cruise (excluding any insurance premiums or amendment charges), you will be able to cancel your booking. If you cancel your booking, you will then be held liable for full payment of the cruise price for your cruise, except for any insurance premiums and amendment charges. We will tell you about any increase in the cost of your cruise by sending you or your travel agent a surcharge invoice. You may decide to pay the amount of the increase printed on that invoice to tell us in writing that you want to cancel. If you do not advise us in writing that you wish to cancel within 7 days, we shall assume you wish to continue with your cruise. Any such additional amount must be paid with the balance of the cost of the cruise or within 14 days of the issue date printed on that invoice. You will not be given a first free. We will not ask you to pay more within 30 days of departure. Please note, changes and errors occasionally occur. You must check the price of your chosen holiday at the time of booking. From time to time we will have special offers on our cruises. If you wish to change your booking to take advantage of these offers then you will have to cancel your existing booking, whereupon our standard cancellation policy will apply. We reserve the right to charge an administration fee of A\$100 per person to make any such changes.

1.5 Cancellations and refunds

If you or anyone travelling with you wishes to cancel your/their cruise, you must immediately give notice in writing to us and/or your travel agent, if you wish to cancel your notice of cancellation on your behalf. The cruise will only be deemed cancelled from the date we actually receive written notice of cancellation from you or your travel agent. We will not issue a refund unless you then apply. Insurance premiums and or amendment charges cannot be refunded in the event of cancellation.

* In instances where the deposit amount paid is higher than the 25/50/75% of cruise fare cancellation charge, then the highest of the two amounts is payable as the cancellation charge. In this instance, the deposit amount stands.

Depending on the reason for your cancellation, you may be able to reclaim the cancellation charges (less any applicable excess) under the terms of your travel insurance policy. Claims must be made directly to the insurance company concerned. Where any cancellation request exceeds the number of full paying members below the number on which the price, number of free places and/or any concessions agreed for your booking was based, we will recalculate your holiday cost and re-invoice you accordingly. Any invoice must be paid within 7 days if rendered within 70 days of sailing (90 days in the event of holiday sailings). In all other instances, invoices for any such cost increases must be paid within the time frame stipulated for the payment of the balance due on the original booking. In the event that you incur any cost increase to a booking due to a cancellation we will reimburse the time limit specified, we reserve the right to cancel the booking and in those circumstances, normal cancellation charges will apply.

1.6 Changing your booking

Subject to availability, some changes can be made to your booking. You may request changes via your travel agent up to 45 days before departure. We will make every effort to meet your change request; however, we cannot promise that we will be able to make any requested change. Up to 45 days before departure an agent will be able to make changes available for each change requested. If you require a change within 45 days of departure, this will be treated as a cancellation of your original booking and cancellation charges will be set out in the terms and conditions that will be payable. The changed arrangements will then be treated as a new booking.

If you or any of the people travelling with you are prevented from taking the cruise you/they may give your travel agent the booking to someone else (suggested by you). In this situation, providing we are given not less than 14 days notice in writing of your wish to make the change, we will permit the name change on payment of an administration fee of A\$50. A maximum of only one passenger name may be changed per cabin. You must produce documentary proof of the reason for the transfer with the request (e.g. a letter from a doctor). You must ensure that the administrative fee and any charges/costs – as well as any amount which is still due to be paid for the cruise – are paid in full as required. We reserve the right to cancel the booking and all charges remain outstanding.

1.7 Fuel supplement

We recommend we impose a fuel supplement on all guests if the price of West Texas intermediate fuel exceeds US\$56.00 per barrel. The fuel supplement for 1st and 2nd guests would be no more than US\$10 per person per day, to a maximum of US\$150 per cruise. For additional guests there would be no more than US\$5 per person per day, to a maximum of US\$70 per cruise.

1.8 Travel insurance

All guests must have appropriate personal travel insurance before departure, which includes a minimum of cover for the cost of repatriation to someone else of assistance including repatriation in the event of an accident or illness, and the cost of medical treatment in the onboard medical centre. All services provided by a qualified medical centre (including medication consultations and treatments) are not covered by private health insurance policies or by Australian Medicare and the New Zealand Accident Compensation Corporation (including cruises sailing to only Australian ports within Australia).

We recommend that you contact your travel agent or an independent insurance broker for details of suitable policies.

1.9 Visas and passports

You are responsible to ensure that you have all necessary visas and that your passport is up to date and valid for at least 6 months after the expiry date of the termination of your cruise. Please check the applicable passport and visa requirements with the

embassies of the countries you will be visiting during your cruise, or check the up to date position with your travel agent. Any loss or theft of a passport, which is not protected, it is essential that your passport expiration date not occur within 6 months of the voyage termination date. If you are travelling to the USA under the Visa Waiver Programme, you and all members of your party (including children) must ensure that you and all other members of your party's passports are machine-readable. A passport is machine-readable when there are two lines of letters, numbers and chevrons (>>>>>>) printed across the long edge of the personal information page (the page with photograph and personal details). The machine-readable text will appear on a white strip on either passports and directly on the pink page of newer passports. If there are no such lines of text on the personal information page of your passport, the machine-readable. This may vary by country and if you are unsure as to what type of passport you hold, please check with your national passport office.

From 26 October 2004, anyone travelling to the USA under the Visa Waiver Programme without a machine-readable passport will need a visa to travel to the USA. If you are travelling to the USA after October 2006 under the Visa Waiver Programme and are carrying a passport which is not machine-readable, you will be required to have a biometric passport. Travellers with valid machine readable passports issued before October 2006 travelling to the USA under the Visa Waiver Programme may be required to carry two passports up to, and beyond, October 2006. If your passport is issued after 26 October 2006 and it is not biometric, you will not qualify for visa-free travel but will be required to carry two machine-readable passports, please ask at the time of booking or contact your National Passport Office.

Please note that this information is particularly subject to change and you must check the up-to-date requirements in regard to the validity of your passport. Please note: certain persons may not be eligible to enter the United States visa-free under the Visa Waiver Programme. These include, but are not limited to, for example, people who are arrested and not cleared if the arrest did not result in a criminal conviction and those with criminal records. If you are in any doubt whatsoever as to whether you can travel under the Visa Waiver Programme, you are strongly advised to contact the Consular Information unit at the US Embassy before you book your holiday with us. If you are not a citizen of a country participating in the Visa Waiver Programme, you must check the applicable visa requirements with the embassies of the countries that you will be visiting during your holiday. This includes any technical stops such as Prince Rupert.

We regret that we cannot accept any liability if you are prevented from taking the cruise you/they may give otherwise suffer any difficulties or incur any costs as a result of not having the correct passport and/or any required visa.

Passport and visa requirements may change and vary from time to time. Please contact your travel agent to identify and obtain all required travel documents and have them available when necessary. These appropriate valid travel documents such as passports, visas, inoculation certificates and family legal documents are required for boarding and re-entry into the United States and other countries. Guests who do not possess the proper documentation may be prevented from boarding the ship or ship or if entering a foreign country and may be subject to fines. No refunds will be given to individuals who fail to bring proper documentation.

You must ensure that exactly the same name (including initials) appears on your ticket as in your passport. If there is any difference, you may be refused entry onto your flight/cruise. We regret we cannot accept any liability if you are refused entry onto any flight or into any country or otherwise suffer any difficulties or incur any costs as a result of not having an acceptable passport or any required visas.

Certain Port Authorities may from time to time ask to see photo identification when you depart the ship during the cruise. We strongly suggest that you take a photocopy of your passport in addition to your passport itself with you on holiday and carry the photocopy with you each time you depart the ship in order to minimise any inconvenience this may cause.

1.10 Personal belongings

Please make sure that all valuable and important items (for example, medicines, jewellery, fragile items, important travel and other documents, video/camera/computer equipment) are carried by hand and not packed in your luggage or left unsecured in your cabin or on the aircraft. Spare coats/clothes must be taken of such items. For your protection once onboard, all valuable and important items should be deposited with the ship's medical centre. You are also strongly advised to take out appropriate and adequate insurance to protect such items. We cannot accept any responsibility or liability for loss or damage to items or that it was insured with the Guest Relations Desk for safekeeping. For items which are so deposited, the most we may be liable to pay you if any items is lost or damaged (or any other loss or damage) is the amount deposited for the cruise. If you discover any loss, delay or damage when on board, you must immediately report it to the Guest Relations Desk. The time limits for notifying any loss, delay or damage will be the same as those that apply, which is apparent, must be notified to ourselves and the supplier of the service concerned (if it is not us) before

or, at latest, at the time of departure from the ship or, for other services, whilst using or at the end of using those services. Any loss or damage, which is not apparent, must be notified to ourselves and the supplier of the service concerned (if it is not us) within 15 days of departure from the ship or the end of your using the service in question. In all cases, you must give credit for payments received from any airline and/or other supplier in connection with your claim. You must also give us details of any relevant insurance coverage you hold. In appropriate cases we are entitled to ask you to provide a receipt for the amount received from any/all insurance companies.

1.11 Banned Items

You must not pack in any luggage or bring onboard any item specified as dangerous or illegal (e.g. guns, explosives, drugs, animals, flammable items, etc.). In addition, we may specify other items which you must not bring on board. We may refuse to allow you to take onboard any item which we consider to be inappropriate. If we or the Master of the ship have reason to believe that any cabin may contain any item or substance which should not have been brought onboard, the Master or an authorised officer has the right to enter and search the cabin concerned and seize any such item or substance. Special Notice: Due to the new enhanced airport security measures, please ensure that any sharp items (including but not limited to scissors, nail blades, nail clippers, tweezers and knitting needles, are packed in your check-in luggage and not in your hand luggage.

1.12 Lost, delayed or damaged property

This clause applies in relation to any loss, delay or damage to property which occurs during your cruise or whilst using our services or services provided or arranged by us, except for any claims in relation to any valuable or important items (see clause 1.10). It is our guest's responsibility to ensure that the contents of their luggage and/or items they depart their cruise in are left onboard, whilst we assist them in trying to recover the item, if we are unable to do so, then we cannot be held responsible and we will refer you to your travel insurance policy to make a claim for the item. Please note that items left behind may be destroyed.

If you discover the loss, delay or damage when onboard, you must immediately report it to the Guest Relations Desk. The time limits for notifying any loss, delay or damage, and the maximum amount which will be payable by us, are indicated in the table below. Any damage or delay, which is apparent, must be notified to ourselves and the supplier of the service concerned (if it is not us) before or, at latest, at the time of departure from the ship or, for other services, whilst using or at the end of using those services. Any loss, damage or delay, which is not apparent, must be notified to ourselves and the supplier of the service concerned (if it is not us) within 15 days of departure from the ship or the end of your using the service in question. If you can prove that the damage, delay or loss was our fault or the fault of the supplier of a service that we agreed to arrange as part of your holiday, we will compensate you for the loss or damage and we can prove you have suffered as a result up to a maximum of US\$1,100 per guest per cruise.

This will also be the case where any property is damaged, delayed or lost whilst not on board or getting on or off the ship but using other services (apart from air travel) which form part of the holiday we have contractually agreed to provide. In all cases, you must give us credit for payments you have received or will receive from any airline and/or other supplier in connection with your claim. You must also give us details of any relevant insurance coverage you hold. In appropriate cases we are entitled to ask you to reduce your claim by the amount received from any/all insurance companies.

1.13 Lost, delayed or damaged luggage during air travel

Any damage, delay or loss suffered during any travel by air (including the process of getting on and off the aircraft) must be notified to the airline at the time of discovery or, in any event, in writing within 7 days of the end of the flight concerned for damage or loss or within 21 days of the luggage being made available for you in the event of a delay. The maximum amount we may have to pay you in the event of any damage, destruction, delay or loss of luggage or property is the most which is payable under the relevant international convention or other applicable law. The Montreal Convention is the Montreal Convention 1999. Where the Montreal Convention 1999 applies, the maximum we or the airline will have to pay you at present for loss, destruction, damage, delay or destruction of your luggage (checked or passenger) unless special conditions apply. The airline will not be liable to pay any compensation if the airline can prove that it took all reasonable steps to avoid the damage, delay or loss or that it was insured for the airline or its employees to take such measures. In all cases, you must give us credit for payments received from any airline or other supplier in connection with your claim. You must also give us details of any relevant insurance coverage you hold. In appropriate cases we are entitled to ask you to reduce your claim by the amount received from any insurance company.

1.14 Dining

We cannot accept any bookings which are conditional on your preferred seating time being or becoming available before departure. If you cancel because your preferred seating time is not available (whether or not this was confirmed at the time of booking), our normal cancellation charges will apply. Seating time requests cannot be guaranteed.

1.15 Special dietary requests

Royal Caribbean International does not provide baby food. To accommodate guests with special requirements such as dietary requirements, medical requirements, pier embarkation assistance, wheelchair use etc., Royal Caribbean International requires the information in writing 45 days prior to departure. Please contact your travel agent with any special requests must be supplied in writing 100 days prior to sail date for sailings in Australia/New Zealand and Asia, 90 days prior to the sail date for sailings in Europe and South America and 60 days prior to sailings in North America. Any dietary requirements caused by medical conditions must be provided to us at the time of booking.

1.16 Special requests

Special request cannot be guaranteed. Whilst we and our suppliers will endeavour to meet reasonable special requests, we regret we cannot be held responsible if the supplier will be able to do so. Not meeting any special request for any reason will not be a breach of contract on our part. If a special request will only be met at an additional cost, this cost will either be payable to you prior to departure or will be payable locally by you. Unless specifically agreed by us in writing at the time of booking, we cannot accept any booking which is conditional on a special request. In the event that such bookings will be treated as "normal" bookings subject to the above comments on special requests.

1.17 Consumption of alcohol onboard

We will not sell or serve alcoholic drinks to anyone under 21 years of age. However on cruises departing from European, South American and Asian countries and from Australia/New Zealand where the legal drinking age is typically lower than 21, a parent/legal guardian who is sailing with the person aged between 18 to 20, may sign a waiver allowing the 18 to 20 year old to consume alcoholic beverages (beer and wine only). Only a parent or legal guardian may sign this waiver and there are no exceptions to this policy. The 18 to 20 year old must agree to comply with Royal Caribbean International's policies, including those relating to alcohol consumption, and consent to such beverages to any other person, regardless of age. Restrictions apply, and this policy is subject to change without notice. An individual's age on the date of sailing determines his or her status for the entire cruise.

Guests are not allowed to bring alcoholic beverages onboard for consumption on the ship or at any port. Alcoholic beverages that are purchased in ports of call or from onboard shops will be stored by the ship and delivered to guest cabins on the last day of the sailing. Sealed and unopened containers (such as wine bottles, moutwhage, luggage etc.) and will dispose of containers holding alcohol. Please note: due to Spanish regulations, we are not permitted to sell alcohol or beverages on board in duty free shops on selected sailings which depart from Spain.

Royal Caribbean International's Guest Relations Policy may be enforced, up to and including disembarkation, if a guest violates any alcohol policy. Guests who violate any alcohol policies, (over consume, provide alcohol to people under age 21, demonstrate irresponsible behaviour, or attempt to conceal alcoholic items at security and/or luggage check points or any other time), may be disembarked or not allowed to board, at their own expense, in accordance with our Guest Vacation Policies. Royal Caribbean International is committed to the responsible service of alcohol and reserves the right to revoke or otherwise restrict the service of alcohol to guests who are under 21 years of age. Additional policies for groups are located in the Appendices of the Travel Agent Guide and are enforced without exception.

Guests under the age of 21 will not have alcohol returned to them. If a guest requests a birthday that will change their adherence to our alcohol policy, they may visit the Guest Relations Desk and on showing their passport as proof of age, their records will be updated to allow them to purchase and consume alcohol, as long as the other requirements of our alcohol policy are met.

1.18 Luggage at the end of your cruise

It is our guest's responsibility to remove all of their belongings from their cabin when they depart their cruise. If an item is left onboard, whilst we will assist you in trying to recover the item, if we are unable to do so, then we cannot be held responsible for the item. You to your travel insurance to make a claim for the item. Please note that items left behind may be destroyed.

1.19 Guests with special needs

You must ensure that you are medically and physically fit for travel and that such travelling will not endanger yourself or anyone else. At the time of booking (or as soon as possible) we will ask you to provide us with you must tell us or your travel agent in writing about any medical or physical condition which will or may require medical treatment or attention during your Royal Caribbean International cruise. Any such information we are entitled to use as any services or facilities). Please provide as much information as possible.

Guests who use wheelchairs must provide their own collapsible wheelchair and may find certain areas of the ship inaccessible. For guests who use a wheelchair, wheelchair or scooter onboard you must contact your travel agent at the time of booking to provide the dimensions as size limitation may apply and we may not be able to accommodate this request.

Certain conditions (for example, use of small tender boats to transport guests from ship to shore) may prevent guests with wheelchairs from going ashore at certain ports of call. Guests affected by a disability or medical condition who require special assistance, such as dietary requirements, medical requirements, pier embarkation assistance, wheelchair use etc., Royal Caribbean International requires the information in writing 45 days prior to departure. Please contact your travel agent with any special requests must be supplied in writing 100 days prior to sail date for sailings in Australia/New Zealand and Asia, 90 days prior to the sail date for sailings in Europe and South America and 60 days prior to sailings in North America. Any dietary requirements caused by medical conditions must be provided to us at the time of booking.

1.20 Minimum age to travel

No person under twenty-one (21) ("a minor") may sail on any cruise holiday or have a cabin on his or her own unless accompanied by a parent or guardian or by another authorised person who is over the age of twenty-one (21). No person under the age of twenty-one (21) will be booked in a cabin unless accompanied by an adult twenty-one (21) years of age or older, except for minors sailing with their parents or legal guardians in adjacent cabins. Any minor who is not travelling with at least one of their parents/legal guardian(s) will only be permitted to travel on the ship under the terms of a cruise if accompanied by a person(s) over the age of twenty-one (21). For minors aged 17 or under at the start of the sailing, written authorisation from a parent or legal guardian of the minor is required. For minors 18, 19 or 20 at the start of the sailing authorisation is not required.

Adults who are not the parent or legal guardian of any child travelling with them are required to present the relevant child's applicable passport or birth certificate (or copy of child's birth certificate) and an original legally affirmed or notarised letter signed by at least one of the child's parents/legal guardians. The letter must be authorised by a parent or legal guardian of the child on the specified cruise and must authorise the travelling adult to supervise the child, sign applicable sports waivers and permit any medical treatment that must be administered to the child, which is the opinion of the treating doctor needs to be carried out without delay. A letter can be legally affirmed or notarised by a practicing solicitor, notary or commissioner for oaths who may be contacted through the local consulate. Evidence is not produced, the minor(s) concerned will not be permitted to board the ship or undertake the cruise.

We will not be responsible for any costs, expenses or losses suffered as a result either by the minor affected, the parent or legal guardian of the minor, the parent or him/herself), or any persons travelling with the minor who decide not to continue with the holiday as a result of the failure to produce a letter of authorisation as set out above. We will not pay any compensation or any refund to any minor who we have not permitted to board the ship, any person paying for the minor's holiday (if not the minor him/herself), or any persons travelling with the minor who decide not to continue with the cruise themselves as a result of the failure to produce a letter of authorisation.

Please note that parents'(s)/legal guardian travelling with a child who has a different surname to the parent(s) or legal guardian(s) must produce official proof such as a full birth certificate/divorce papers etc to prove that they are the parent(s)/legal guardian of the children concerned.

Individual cabins can be booked by married couples whose minimum age are eighteen (18) (proof of marriage is required at time of booking).

The minimum age for infants to sail is six (6) months, as of the date of sailing and twelve (12) months, as of the date of sailing for Transatlantic, Transpacific, Hawaii, selected South American cruises and other selected cruises. The health and safety of our guests is our number one priority. As such, in consideration of the limitations of the shipboard medical facility, equipment and staff, the company cannot accept waivers, releases or refunds for infants to sail on this policy.

1.21 Delayed departures and itinerary changes

We regret we cannot guarantee that ships will call at every advertised port or follow every part of the advertised itinerary. We and the Master of the ship have the right to omit any port(s), call at any additional port(s), deviate from the advertised itinerary in any way or substitute another port or port. In addition, we will not be responsible for any failure to meet the arrival or departure times shown in this brochure for any port(s) of call. Normally, changes in the itinerary are to protect the interest and safety of our guests. Please also see clause 1.22.

Changes to the last confirmed itinerary for your cruise may become necessary after you have departed for a variety of reasons such as severe weather conditions, sea conditions, guest emergencies, providing assistance to other vessels and the ship being unable to operate at its normal speed(s) due to unexpected mechanical or technical difficulties arising. We will endeavour to avoid any changes which will have a significant detrimental effect on your last confirmed itinerary. However, we cannot accept any liability in respect of any change to the itinerary. From our cruise control we control (see clause 1.13) or which do not have a significant detrimental effect.

1.22 If we change or cancel your cruise

Occasionally, we have to make changes to and correct errors in the brochure and other details both before, and after, departure. If you are notified of a change, we may rarely, cancel confirmed bookings. Whilst we always endeavour to avoid changes and cancellations, we reserve the right to do so. If we have to make a significant change to the itinerary, we will endeavour, as possible, if there is time to do so before departure, we will offer you the choice of the following options for significant changes:

- (a) accepting the changed arrangements, or
- (b) purchasing an alternative holiday from us of, a similar standard to that originally booked if available. If we are unable to do this, you may be offered a holiday of equivalent or higher standard for which you will not be asked to pay any more than the price of the original holiday. In the event that the price of the original holiday will refund the price difference. If you do not wish to accept the holiday we specifically offer you, you may choose any of our other then available holidays. The price of any such holiday shall be applicable. This will mean you will pay more if it is more expensive or receive a refund if it is cheaper than your original holiday.
- (c) cancelling or accepting the cancellation in which case we will provide a full refund of all monies you have paid to us.

Please note, the above options are not available where any changes made are minor or insignificant.

1.23 What is a significant change in the context of these terms and conditions?

A significant change is a change to your confirmed holiday which can reasonably be said to have a significant and/or material effect on the cruise and/or minor changes are as follows: Significant change: A change from two days port of calls to two days sailing instead. Minor change: A change from one port of call to one port of call. A change from one port of call to one day's sailing. A change in timings for any port(s) of call but the ship still calls at the port concerned. A change in order of ports that are visited. Very rarely, you may be forced to take a longer cruise (30) to change or terminate your holiday after departure but before the scheduled end of your time away. This is a significant change. We will endeavour to refund, we regret we will be unable to make any refunds (unless we obtain any refunds from our suppliers), pay you any compensation or meet any costs or expenses you incur as a result.

1.24 Can you refuse to allow me to travel?

If in our opinion, the ship's Master or our reasonable opinion, you are or appear to be unfit for travel, or you are or pose a risk or danger to yourself or a danger to others or behave in such a way as to cause or be liable to cause or damage to the ship, the other members of the party or danger to property, we are entitled without prior notice to refuse to allow you to travel on any ship and to terminate your cruise holiday at any time. You must ensure that you are fit to travel and accept the calls without our incurring any liability. You will have to pay any costs, expenses or losses suffered as a result, travel and accommodation, and we will not pay any compensation or give you any refund or reimbursement. However, at our discretion, the cruise only may be refunded.

Please note that parents'(s)/legal guardian travelling with a child who has a different surname to the parent(s) or legal guardian(s) must produce official proof such as a full birth certificate/divorce papers etc to prove that they are the parent(s)/legal guardian of the children concerned.

Individual cabins can be booked by married couples whose minimum age are eighteen (18) (proof of marriage is required at time of booking).

If Royal Caribbean determines that certain guests are in violation of these guidelines, we may be forced to ask the offending party to leave the ship at the next available port of call. These policies are subject to change without notice and without liability to Royal Caribbean International. Royal Caribbean International's Policy does not adopt and does not state in these Policies. These policies are located in the Cruise Services Directory and at Guest Relations.

1.26 Making a complaint

In the unlikely event of a reason to complain whilst making a you, you must immediately notify the Guest Relations Desk onboard ship and the supplier of the service(s) in question (if not us). This is to ensure that we are given the opportunity to investigate and attempt to resolve any issue you raise. Any verbal complaint must be put in writing and given to the supplier and us as soon as possible. If a problem cannot be resolved or technically cannot be resolved, we will advise you of your right to write to us on your return to the address below. You must give your booking reference number and full details of your complaint within 28 days of your return on any shore holiday. From our cruise control we control (see clause 1.13) or which do not have a significant detrimental effect.

complaint is written on behalf of other members of your travelling party, their full names and booking reference numbers must be clearly stated in the correspondence together with their authority for you to handle the complaint on their behalf. If you fail to follow this complaints procedure, your right to claim compensation may be affected or even lost as a result.

We both agree that any dispute or claim will be dealt with by a court located in Miami, Florida, USA, to the exclusion of the courts of any other state, territory or country.

We can only pay you compensation if the following conditions are met:

- If asked to do so, the person(s) affected must transfer to us any rights they have against the supplier or whoever else is responsible for your claim and complaint.
- The person(s) affected must agree to cooperate fully with us and our insurers if we or our insurers want to enforce any rights transferred to us.

1.27 Our liability

(1) Subject to clause 1.28 below we promise to make sure that the holiday arrangements we have agreed to make, perform or provide as applicable as part of our contract will be performed or provided with reasonable skill and care. This means that, subject to these booking conditions, we will accept responsibility if, for example, you suffer death or personal injury or your contracted holiday arrangements are not provided as promised or prove deficient as a result of the failure of ourselves, our employees, agents or suppliers to use reasonable skill and care in making, performing or providing, as applicable, your contracted holiday arrangements. Please note it is your responsibility to show that reasonable skill and care has not been used if you wish to make a claim against us. In addition, we will only be responsible for what our employees, agents and suppliers do or do not do if they were at the time acting within the course of their employment (for employees) or carrying out work we had asked them to do (for agents and suppliers).

(2) We will not be responsible for any injury, illness, death, loss (for example loss of enjoyment), damage, expense, cost or other sum or claim of any description whatsoever which results from any of the following:

- The act(s) and/or omission(s) of the person(s) affected or any member(s) of their party or
- The act(s) and/or omission(s) of a third party not connected with the provision of your holiday and which were unforeseeable or unavoidable or
- 'force majeure' as defined in clause 1.30

Please note, we cannot accept any liability for any damage, loss, expense or other sum(s) of any description (1) which on the basis of the information given to you concerning the provision of your holiday or your accepting it, we could not have foreseen you would suffer or incur if we breached our contract with you or (2) which did not result from any breach of contract or other fault by ourselves or our employees or, where we are responsible for them, our suppliers. Additionally we cannot accept liability for any business losses.

Please note, we cannot accept responsibility for any services, which do not form part of our contract.

This includes, for example, any additional services or facilities, which your hotel or any other supplier agrees to, provide for you where the services or facilities are not advertised in our brochure, and we have not agreed to arrange them. In addition, regardless of any wording used by us on our website, in any of our brochures or elsewhere, we only promise to use reasonable skill and care as set out above and we do not have any greater or different liability to you. The promises we make to you about the services we have agreed to provide or arrange as part of our contract - and the laws and regulations of the country in which your claim or complaint occurred - will be used as the basis for deciding whether the services in question had been properly provided. If the particular services which gave rise to the claim or complaint complied with local laws and regulations applicable to those services at the time, the services will be treated as having been properly provided. This will be the case even if the services did not comply with the laws and regulations of the US, which would have applied had those services been provided in the US. The exception to this is where the claim or complaint concerns the absence of a safety feature which might lead a reasonable holiday maker to refuse to take the holiday in question.

1.28 Our limit of liability

Please note: The provisions of the Convention relating to the Carriage of Passengers and their luggage by sea 1974 ('The Athens Convention') apply to your cruise, as well as the process of getting on and/or off the ship. For any claim involving death or personal injury or delay or loss of or damage to luggage the only liability we have to you is as set out in clause 1.28 of the Athens Convention. This means you are not entitled to make any claim against us which is not expressly permitted by The Athens Convention or which is in excess of the limits provided by The Athens Convention. Any claims covered under The Athens Convention must be made within the time limits set out in The Athens Convention. The Athens Convention limits the maximum amount as the carrier has to pay if found liable in the event of death or personal injury or loss of damage to luggage and makes special provision for valuables. For death

and personal injury, this limit is presently approximately US\$250,000 per person. For claims concerning luggage and valuables, please see other clauses of these terms and conditions. Where any claim or part of a claim (including those involving death or personal injury) concerns us it is based on any travel arrangements (including the process of getting on and/or off the transport concerned) provided by any air, rail or road carrier or any stay in a hotel, the maximum amount of compensation we will have to pay you will be limited. The most we will have to pay you for that claim or that part of a claim if we are found liable to you on any basis is, except as otherwise expressly set out in the Booking Conditions, the most the carrier or hotel keeper concerned would have to pay under the International Convention or Regulation which applies to the travel arrangements or hotel stay in question (for example, the Warsaw Convention as amended or unamended and the Montreal Convention). Please note: Where a carrier or hotel keeper is liable to you for that claim or part of a claim if we are found liable to you on any basis is, except as otherwise expressly set out in the Booking Conditions, the most the carrier or hotel keeper concerned would have to pay under the International Convention or Regulation in respect of a claim or part of a claim, we similarly are not obliged to make a payment to you for that claim or part of the claim. When making any payment, we are entitled to deduct any money which you have received or are entitled to receive from the transport provider or hotelier for the complaint or claim in question. Copies of the applicable International Conventions and Regulations are available from us on request.

1.29 Your liability

You must ensure that you are using an up-to-date brochure when you book your cruise. We cannot accept any liability whatsoever for any mistakes or any incorrect/inaccurate information which results from the use of any out-of-date brochure. It is your responsibility to ensure that you and everyone travelling with you have all necessary passports, visas and all other travel documents and that these are valid and in order.

1.30 Circumstances outside of our control

Except where we specifically say otherwise in these terms and conditions, we cannot accept any liability or pay any compensation where your cruise or any other services we have promised to arrange or provide cannot be provided at all or as promised as a result of circumstances which are outside our control ('force majeure'). When we talk about circumstances which are outside our control, we mean any event which we or the supplier of the service in question could not have avoided even after taking all reasonable care. Such events are likely to include but are not limited to war or threat of war, acts of terrorists or threats of such acts, riots or civil unrest, industrial action, natural or nuclear disaster, fire, adverse weather conditions, health risks, epidemics, mechanical difficulties (which we could not have anticipated or avoided despite our normal comprehensive mechanical checks) acts of God and all similar circumstances which are outside our control.

1.31 Other conditions which apply to your cruise

Airlines and our other suppliers have their own conditions which apply to you. Some of these conditions may limit or exclude the airlines' or other suppliers' liability to you, often in accordance with international conventions. Copies of the relevant parts of these conditions should be requested and obtained by you from the supplier.

1.32 Price and brochure accuracy

Royal Caribbean International's policies and procedures are constantly evolving. At the time of printing, all those listed in this brochure were correct. Please note: The information and prices shown in this brochure may have changed by the time you come to book your cruise. Whilst every effort is made to ensure the accuracy of the brochure and prices at the time of printing, regretfully errors do occasionally occur.
